

OUR TRIP TO CANTERBURY 2013 (3TH AND 4TH BILINGUAL ESO)

They also visited the Public Library which is also an interesting museum. They took pictures at the Norman Castle which was built in the times of William the Conqueror (1070).

Finally we went to London on the coldest day of the week and we were able to see Buckingham Palace, Westminster, also the Houses of Parliament and the London Eye. We also visited the National Gallery and in the afternoon, there was time for shopping in Piccadilly, Regent and Oxford Street.
